

How can I get involved?

People, groups and communities



Every local council area will get money for one artist, creative worker, group or organisation to co-create a memorial project.



Co-created means different people and organisations working together.

A **memorial** is an object or structure that is made to remind people of a person or event.



They will be **commissioned** through partnerships in each area.

Commissioned means to arrange for something to be produced.

The partnership could include:

- your local council
- cultural trust
- voluntary organisations
- arts or community organisations working in your area



A lead partner will be the main link for people and communities who want to be part of the programme.



In some areas, partners will work with a small group of community members in the first part of co-creation.

The project will then be available to everyone in the area.



In other areas, everyone who lives there will be invited to co-create with the artist from the very beginning.

In Your Area: Artists and creative practitioners



Remembering Together is a project where artists and people in the community will work together:

- to explore what is meaningful for them and their area
- to decide on a memorial idea



It will care for the experiences of the people that take part in the project.



Artists and creative practitioners will use their creative skills to work with people and communities in different ways.

They will have 15 thousand pounds to cover their fees and materials.

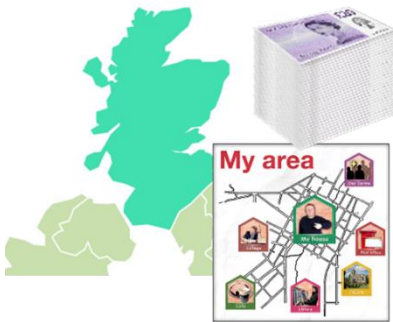


They will have 5 months in Part 1 to work with their community to decide:

- what will our memorial be?
- where it will exist?
 - in a park or greenspace?
 - in a public building?
 - online?



- what form it will take?
 - a site?
 - a garden?
 - a book?
 - a piece of music?
 - a series of walks?
 - movement events?
 - a sculpture?



The projects will be created in Part 2.

Each local council area will get around 100 thousand pounds for the memorial.



The Remembering Together team will have informal Zoom meetings in 2021 and early 2022 for artists and creative workers who are interested in the project.

We would particularly like to hear from artists and creative workers who have experienced:

- illness
- isolation – having very little contact with people
- exclusion – being left out
- racism – being treated differently or unfairly because of the colour of your skin
- ableism – being treated differently or unfairly because you are a disabled person
- ageism - being treated differently or unfairly because of your age
- or because of other challenges and difficulties
